The book “High Conflict: Why We Get Trapped and How We Get Out” by Amanda Ripley has me reflecting on a few related pieces of my life.

2022 SPELLING BEE ENROLLMENT BEGINS THIS FALL!

LCSC enrollment forms will be emailed and mailed to schools in the next few weeks.



Schools can begin enrolling with Scripps on August 22, 2022, at spellingbee.com.

The Scripps enrollment fee is \$175 per school.

Schools must be enrolled with LCSC and Scripps to participate.

The Spelling Bee is geared toward students in grades five through eight, and each school district may send one student for every 1-1,000 K-12 student population.

The fee for each Region IV Spelling Bee participant is \$110.

Five Region IV Spelling Bee students will advance to the Multi-Region State Spelling Bee.

BOTH BEES WILL BE HELD IN FEBRUARY AT LCSC.

Schools that enroll with Scripps in the 2023 Bee program receive the following benefits:

HOW TO START AN ESPORTS LEAGUE IN YOUR HOMETOWN

Esports has been continuously growing in popularity. And for a good reason! It's fun, and it's accessible. Setting up a league allows you to communicate and develop friendships with others who enjoy gaming.

How do you get started? First and foremost, you will need to decide on the goal of your esports league. Is it competitive or casual? What game or games will you be playing? How many players are you looking for? Let's answer that first question. You can have your esports league be a casual, fun experience where everyone is welcome, and players play with or against each other for fun. On the other hand, your esports league could focus on the more competitive aspect of esports, where you would form teams and have those teams practice and compete against one another. This competitive route could lead to competition with other teams outside of your league.

Okay, you've decided on what kind of league you are running, next is picking what game or games you'll want to be playing. The simplest way to decide this is to engage interested people in your community and see what games are popular. This not only will make your decision on what games to run but give you an idea of how many players you might end up getting.

Good work! You've got what kind of league you have, what games you are playing, and a general idea of how many people might want to join. Now, how do you get those interested in signing up?

Some ideas you can try are social media posts, flyers, or even a small newspaper article.

These are great ways to get people in, but hosting a meeting is the most important. This meeting aims to introduce interested people to the league you've created and then get them to sign up. Set up a time and place for this meeting so people can show up and learn more. Help them take the next steps at this meeting.

You have players and the format for your league, all that's left is to set up playtime. If you have an option for players to meet and play in person, that can amplify the experience, but esports can easily be done remotely from everyone's home. You'll need a way to communicate with everyone, a good option would be to make a Discord server to have everyone in your league have one place to communicate at any time. Once times have been established for when players meet and play, everything should move along nicely with whatever format you have decided on.

With everyone playing and communicating you've successfully set up and begun running your very own esports league. As things progress you can begin gathering more interest, adding more games, and reaching out for competition with other leagues nearby.

School Violence

GRANT FUNDING AVAILABLE

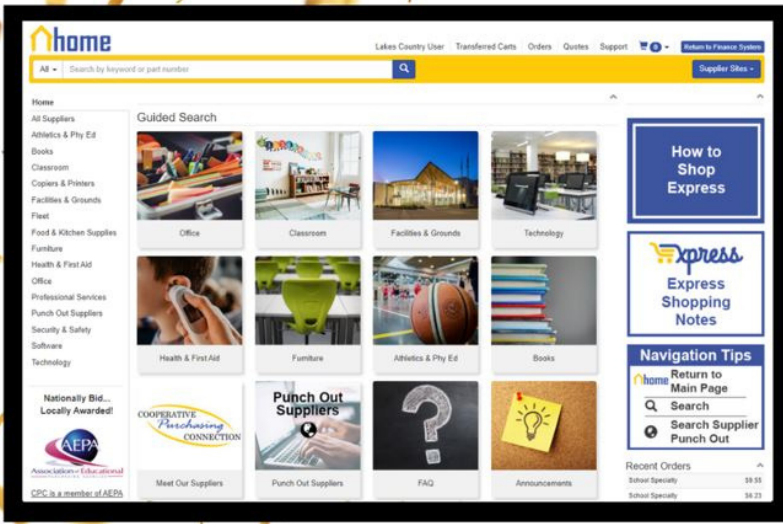
With the alarming and devastating news of the Uvalde, TX tragedy, we would like to remind you Lakes Country Service Cooperative (LCSC) has funding from its multi-year STOP School Violence Grant award to deliver a **"HELPme"** focused School Safety & Wellness Program to MN school districts at **NO COST** for the next two school years. For the grant, LCSC conducted a solicitation and partnered with STOPit Solutions, a national leader in school safety solutions, to deliver their "STOPit" and **"HELPme"** programs. The "STOPit" application's anonymous reporting and the social-emotional library have been expanded with the addition of **HELPme** resources.

HELPme provides support and resources to students, parents, and staff through a healing-centered interface and allows anonymous communication between individuals and school-selected responders. Individuals use **HELPme** to find:

- Customized school and local resources
- Pre-loaded state and federal resources and helplines
- Anonymous communication with school leaders for individual help or help for someone else
- Basic life essentials such as where to find food, transportation, and housing
- Crisis Text Line and other mental health counseling services

These programs provide direct assistance from school leadership to struggling members of the school community with dignity and privacy.

We invite you to join districts around the state to take advantage of this expanded student support program at no direct cost to the district.
